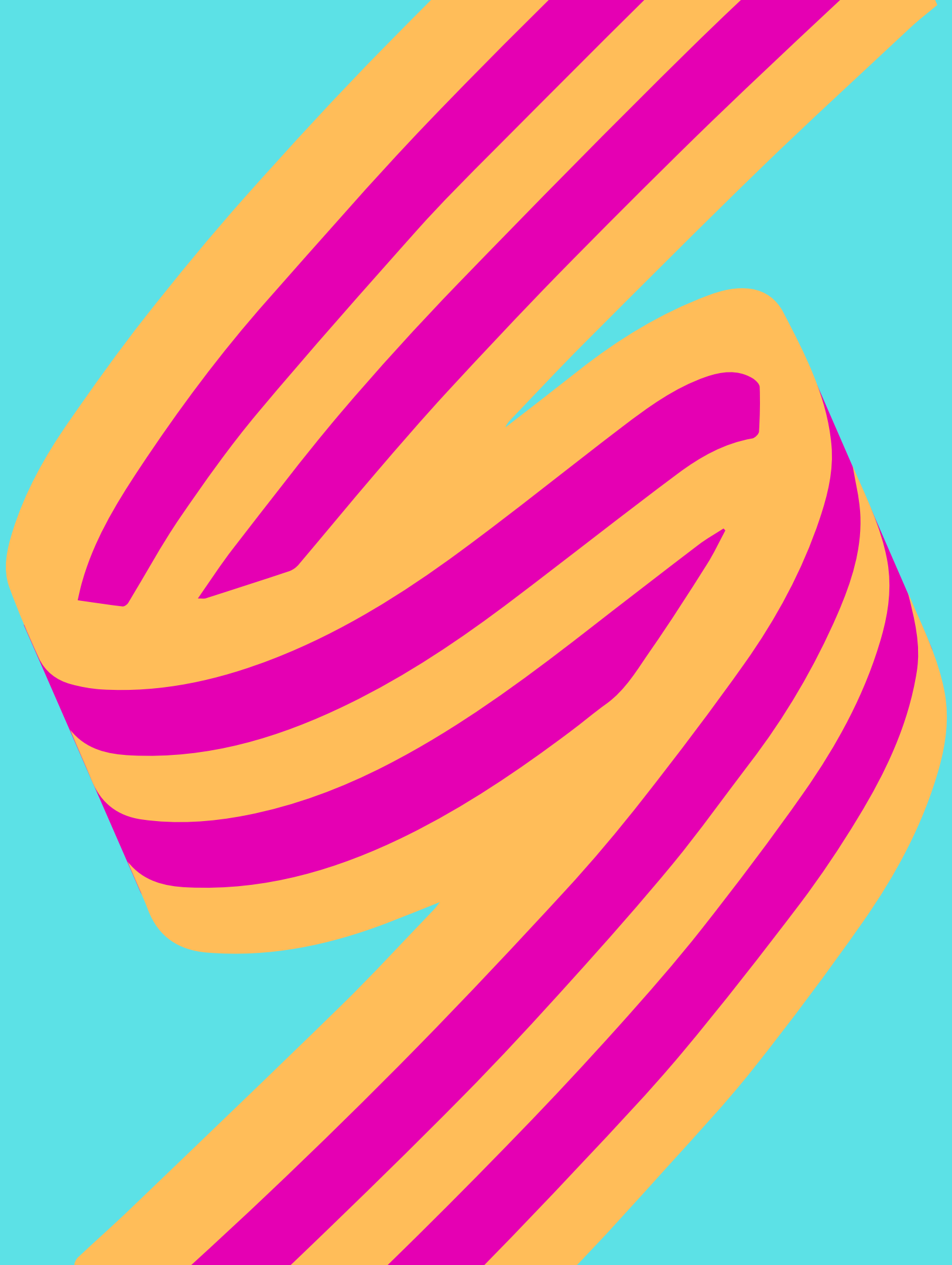






What is Community of Practice?

MGA HINABING PANGARAP

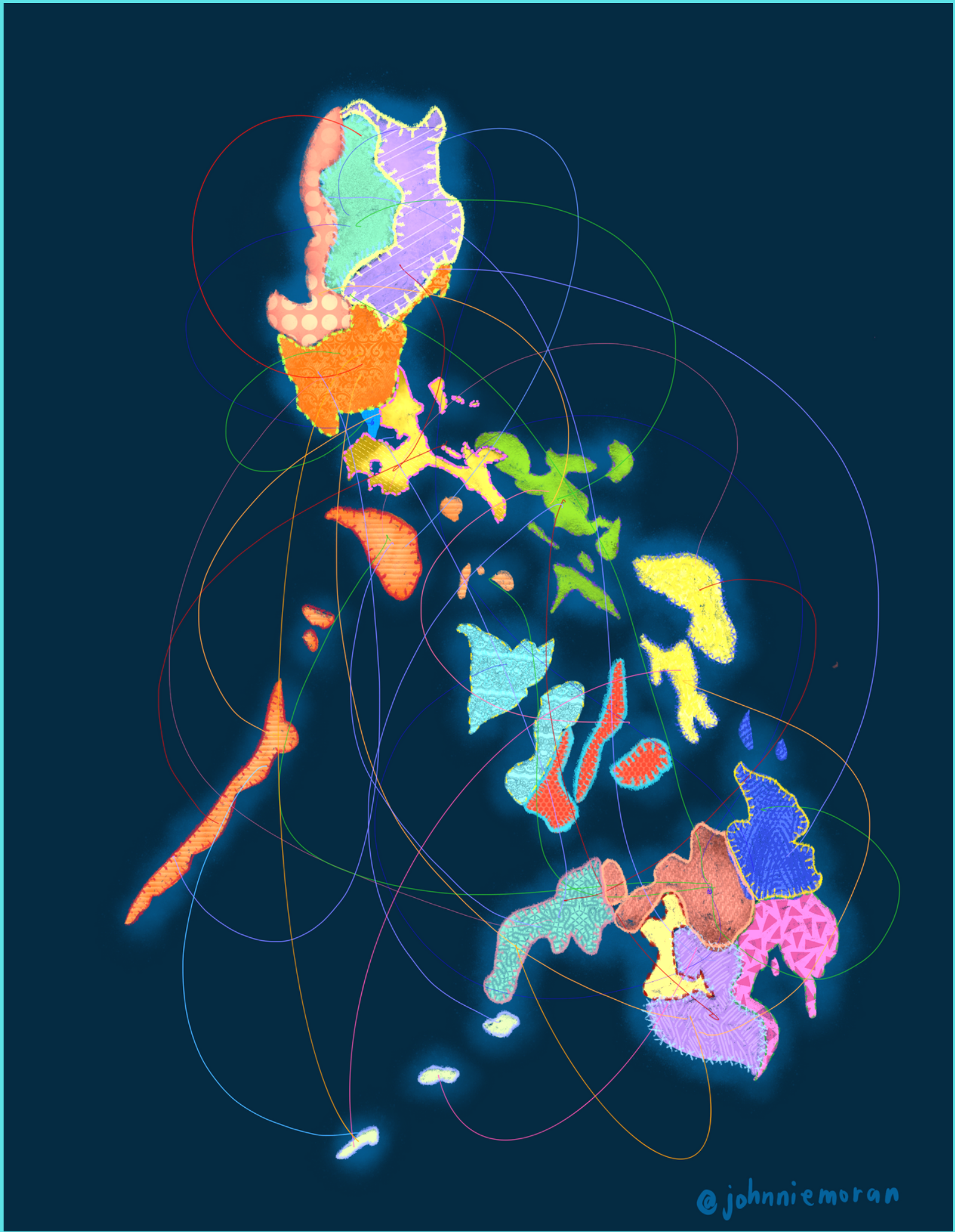

When I first heard of the word 'Enterprising', the first thing that comes to mind was money, business...very technical.

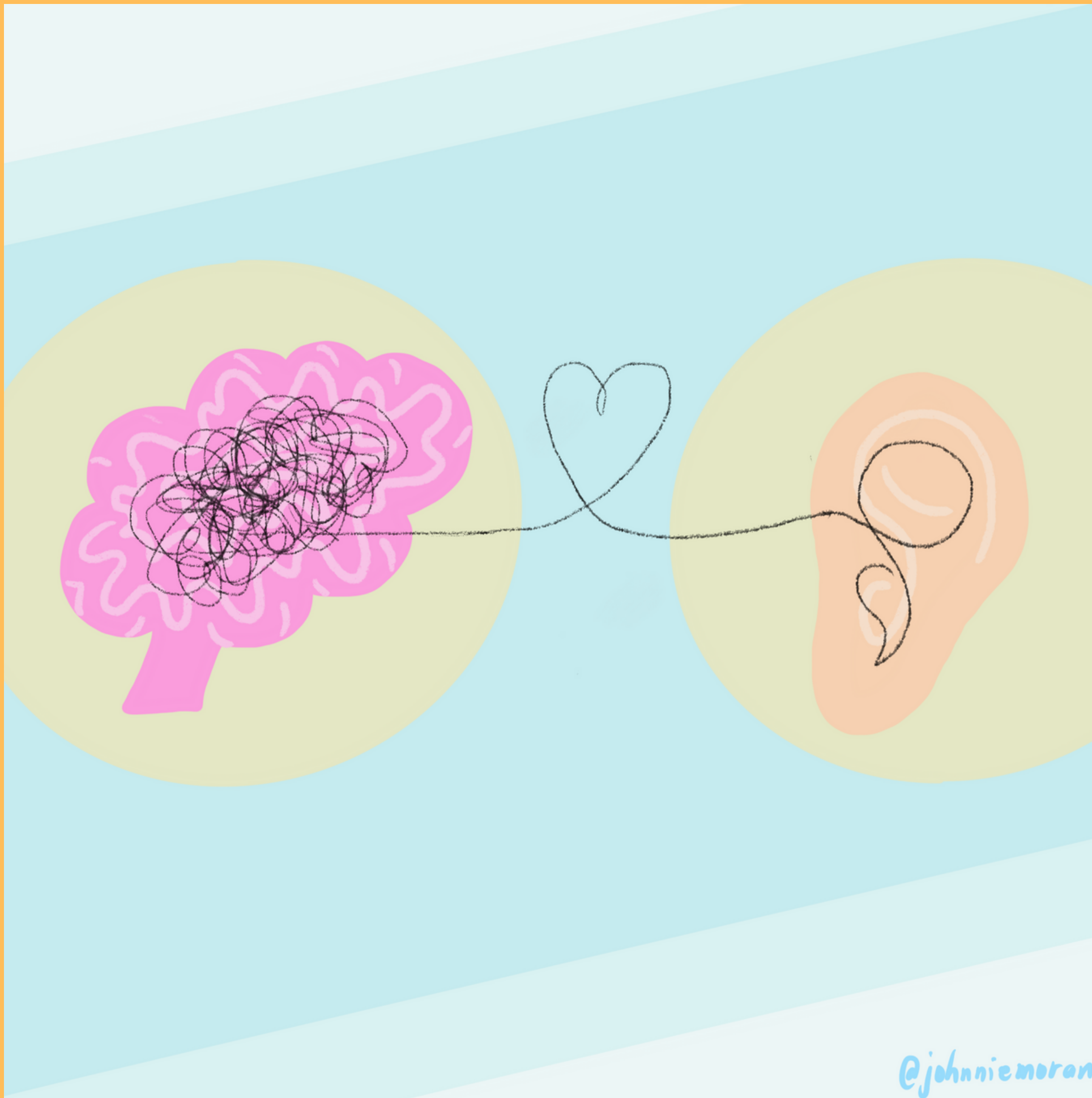
But the sessions gave a sense that the participants' ideas were being cultivated. Yes there were technical sessions but they were essential to the growth of these ideas.
